Canadian County Ag Summit

Area Agriculture Producers and Farmers need to place July 30th on their schedules and attend the Canadian County Agriculture Summit held at the Canadian County Educational Building, 220 N. Country Club Rd., El Reno from 9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. **RSVP by July 27th**.

The 2015 Summit will assist Wheat Producers address the grassy weed challenges they were faced with throughout the 2015 Wheat Harvest. Producers will be provided with viable cropping diversification options to assist them, by adding to their management tools as they consider the rotation of some of their wheat fields to a row crop next spring or early summer of 2016. Several options would be Cotton, Canola, Sorghum, Corn, Soybeans, or Alfalfa to better manage our grassy weed challenges, along with the glyphosate resistance wheat varieties that might fit into some producers operations.

Economic comparisons between continuous wheat production and implementation of some alternative row cropping systems will also be highlighted as opportunities for the 2016 growing season.
