Service Hours:

Master Gardener Trainees must repay 60 hours of service to the Cleveland County Cooperative Extension Service after course completion. Service hours may include the following:

- Responding to horticulture related questions from Cleveland County residents by phone, email or walk-in traffic at the extension office.
- General assistance in the horticulture program.
- General maintenance in the CCMGA Demonstration & Teaching Garden.



Cost:

Registration is \$200.00* per person and includes materials and other associated costs. Master Gardeners who complete certification requirements will receive a \$100 refund and may attend any subsequent years courses free of charge (printed material not included).

***after July 16th fee is non-refundable. Please advise office prior to July 16th if you are unable to fulfill course commitment.**

Qualifications:

1. High School Diploma or equivalent.
2. A genuine interest in horticulture and learning the latest research based practices.
3. Anyone who enjoys fellowship with other gardeners and gardening related programs.
4. Basic computer skills.
5. Interest in joining the Cleveland County Master Gardener Association, a non-profit, volunteer organization.

Program:

- Approximately 50 hours of training from OSU State and County Extension Specialists in: vegetable gardening, lawn care, fruit and nut production, landscape maintenance, tree care and planting, pruning, insect and disease control, soil improvement, plus many other horticulture related areas.
- A jump drive containing copies of OSU Fact Sheets, The Extension Agents Handbook, and the Master Gardener Training Manual. Hard copies of Major Insects of Oklahoma, Growing Oklahoma's Fruit, Nuts, & Vegetables Handbook, and Weeds of Southern Turfgrasses, plus other publications.
- Skills in teaching and providing horticulture information to residents in the community.
- Certificate of graduation upon successful completion of course requirements and payback hours.
