### Choose a travel destination

- It pays to do your homework prior to booking accommodations. Look online, make a phone call, or do both!
- Choose your destination based on your identified goals and desires for traveling.

### Plan your trip

- Know something about the hotel and surrounding area before departure.

### Pack smart

- Start packing a full week before your trip.
- Label your checked and carry-on luggage inside and outside. Luggage tags can get ripped off in baggage handling machinery.
- Take photos of your travel documents and credit cards. Store these photos securely and leave copies with family. If anything gets stolen, you will have the proper information to report.
- Use travel bags or clothing with multiple pockets to help keep things organized. Pockets accessible from the outside provide convenient access to travel items such as an inflatable neck pillow or snacks.
- Place one change of clothing and your important documents in a carry-on bag in case checked luggage is lost or delayed.
