

**OKLAHOMA 4-H/FFA WHEAT SHOW QUALITY
IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM and
STATE 4-H/FFA WHEAT SHOW**

Sponsors: Oklahoma Wheat Commission, Oklahoma Wheat Research Foundation, Oklahoma State University, Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education.

-Purpose-

The purpose of this program is to encourage increased production of wheat with superior market quality.

-Requirements-

1. Fill out the attached report form including story and entry form certifying involvement, and return with wheat sample by 8:30 a.m. July 15, 2009. Samples shipped to Payne County Fairgrounds, **4518 Expo Circle East, Stillwater, Oklahoma 74075, Attn: 4-H/FFA Wheat Contest, must arrive by July 10, 2009. Entries will not be accepted after 8:30 a.m. July 15, 2009.** Submit a 10-pound sample of wheat. Samples will be judged at Heritage Hall, Payne County Fairgrounds, **July 15, 2009 at 8:30 a.m.** From the intersection of Hwy 51 and 177, go east 1.9 miles, then north into the fairgrounds. If you get to the light at Hwy and Fairgrounds Rd, turn North and then West into the Fairgrounds parking lot. Proceed to the west end. Heritage Hall is the second entrance.
2. WHO MAY TAKE PART— Any regularly enrolled 4-H or FFA member. See current 4-H Publication 5 - Oklahoma State 4-H Club Program Policies (**7/1/08-6/30/09**).
3. HOW TO TAKE PART— Plant five acres or more of any variety of hard red or white winter wheat. **Certified or registered seed (verified by certified/registered tag or original certified/ registered seed receipt) is awarded three (3) points in the visual contest.**
4. No more than two varieties may be entered, and they must each have been planted on five (5) acres or more. **Families with two or more 4-H and/or FFA members must insure that each entry is from separate five (5) acre plots.** Members of both 4-H and FFA may enter in only one division (either 4-H or FFA) each year.

Beginning with the 2010 contest, no two or more samples from the same family may be of the same wheat variety.

5. Each Club/Chapter member is required to submit an accurate record of production and marketing costs involved in preparation, seeding, and harvesting the crop. This record is to consist of:
 - (a) **Fully completed 2009** Report Form for Wheat Quality Improvement Program, and
 - (b) A one-page, double-spaced, **typed** story giving the important facts and details relative to producing and marketing the crop. This story is worth up to 5 points and will be scored.



Narrative Report: Write a brief one-page story giving the important facts and details relative to ground preparation, production decisions, weather conditions, harvesting and marketing your wheat crop. This story/report is worth up to 5 points and will be scored.

This report is to be e-mailed by July 13, 2009 with pre-registration form.

Submit one report form and original, separate story for each variety entered (maximum 2 varieties). Bring or send a copy of this Registration and Report form with your entry.

Fasten tag (if seed is certified or registered) to the back of the registration/report page, between the report form and narrative story. Do not cover the front of the report page with the tag. Staple the three pages together once in upper left corner, in this order:

- 1) Registration/Report Form (with certified or registered tag, if certified, affixed to the back of page)
- 2) Narrative report
- 3) Participant Certification form

Please do not use paper clips, and do not put the report and story in a folder or binder.
