

Parenting Education for Teens

Free Loan Program (Kay County Oklahoma residents only)

The following items are available for free-loan through the OSU Extension Center to Kay County schools, agencies, and other non-profit organizations.

Ready-or-Not Tots

These nine baby manikins cry, coo, and burp like a real baby. They cry when needing fed, burping, changing, and attention and when laid face down. Three settings allow teachers to vary the experience of the students and note the treatment of the doll through abuse and tamper indicators as well as student records.

Two dolls have a fourth setting simulating a baby exposed to drug/alcohol. One doll is dark skinned and one doll is African American.

Each doll has three sets of clothing, an infant carrier, blanket, diaper bag, toy and two bottles. A 9-volt battery must be provided by the school, agency, or student.

Dolls are useful for programs emphasizing prevention of child abuse, teen pregnancy prevention, babysitting safety as well as parenting education programs.

Snowbabies The Innocent Victims

Recent studies show that alcohol and drug use is the leading cause of all birth defects in America. This videotape shows the devastating effects of alcohol and drug use on newborns. This is a powerful educational tool for schools, hospitals, treatment center, public health services, etc. 24 minutes. Grades 6-12.

Smokey Sue Smokes For Two

This graphic demonstration of the dangers of smoking should be seen by every teenager and pregnant woman!! As Smokey Sue smokes, smoke passes through a lifelike model of a 7-month fetus. Then tar and nicotine collect at the surface of the water that mimics the placenta, showing graphically what pollutants are reaching the developing baby.

OSU asks that borrower provide cigarettes for the demonstration and that "Sue" is cleaned before returning.
