Bonus Auction

1. Any animal meeting show requirements may be eligible for individual auction. It will be the responsibility of the exhibitor to inform the Superintendent which animal he or she will auction.
2. The Bonus Auction will be conducted at the Murray County Expo Center.
3. Any exhibitor can auction only one animal unless they have two grand champions of any species.
4. Prospect Steers may enter the bonus auction providing it is the only animal an exhibitor has in the show.
5. Prospect steer auction will follow the steer and heifer auction order.
6. Auction order of dairy cattle to follow prospect steer order.
7. Dairy Goats will follow Dairy Cattle.
8. Exhibitors not attending mandatory cleanup meeting will not be allowed to go through the bonus auction unless they make prior arrangements with their 4-H or FFA instructor or committee president

Disputes that arise will be handled by the show committee.

If the problem is of a general nature, assigned superintendent in the department involved will assist in the decision.

Murray County Junior Livestock Show Rules and Regulations

1. Show officials reserve final and absolute right to interpret rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, or differences in regard thereof, or otherwise arising out of, or connected with, or incident to the show.
2. In no case shall the Junior Livestock Board or Murray County Fair Board be responsible for any person coming upon fairgrounds for damage, injury, death or disability by disease or from theft or from any other cause. No claim for injury to any person or animal shall be asserted or suit instituted or maintained against the show or its sponsors or supporters.
3. All animals must be pre-entered by December 16th, 2016 in order to exhibit in the spring 2017 show; no exceptions. Entries must include all information for exhibitor and animal, including OYE nomination tag #, if applicable; Murray County tag #; ear notches; breed of animal; tattoo or registration papers on heifers; swine must be pseudo tested before show date and premise ID #. Pseudo test results must accompany all swine entering the barn and will be checked before unloading. The Tattoo needs to match the paperwork at the time of check in, if not the animal will not be allowed to be shown. Animals must be owned by Exhibitor prior to MCJLS Nomination date. Exhibitor must be sole owner of the animal, and provide daily care, continuously from Nomination date through date of MCJLS. Proof of Ownership may be requested.
4. One breed specific entry per animal for all species is allowed at time of pre entry. Animal must be entered in Murray County only. If nominated in other county animal and exhibitor will be eliminated and disqualified from showing for at least one year.
5. All Animals will require a \$10.00 nomination fee.
6. One exhibitor may show no more than 3 steers, 3 heifers, 3 dairy cattle, 3 market barrows, 3 breeding gilts, 3 market lambs, 3 ewe lambs, 3 doe goats, 3 market goats, 3 dairy goats. No limit on pre-entry. All animals pre-entered must be pre-entered in the student's name that will be exhibiting. It is not necessary at the time of pre-entry to designate if a lamb will be shown as breeding or market.
7. Household Nominations: Students will be allowed to enter and show any animal nominated by an individual from their household according to the following restrictions : The Student must legally reside in the same household and share the same legal address. The student who is entering the animal must have materially participated in the care of the project. Regarding student eligibility, if the student is declared ineligible, any animal entered in that exhibitor's name shall be ineligible for exhibition at the MCJLS.
8. All animals must be in place and ready for weighing at 9:00 a.m., Thursday, February 23, 2017 with exception of Cattle which will be in place at 8:pm on Thursday evening, NO EXCEPTIONS!
9. One official weighing permitted. One set of scales only. One official reweigh for animals too light or too heavy to be held 30 minutes after first weigh in.
10. Showmanship will be divided into three classes/ Senior Division (grades 10-11-12). Intermediate (grades 7-8-9), and Junior Division, (grades 6 and under). Participants must show their own animal in the showmanship division.
11. All exhibits must remain in place until judging of that specific species is completed.
12. Exhibitors will not be permitted to stay overnight at fairgrounds. Watchman will be on duty Wednesday , Thursday and Friday nights Barn will open at 6:00 am and close at 11:00 pm every night—**NO ONE ALLOWED TO STAY IN BARN**

AFTER CLOSING. NO EXCEPTIONS.

13. All animals must be removed from the Fairgrounds by 7:00 pm, Friday, February 24, 2017 Absolutely no animals are to remain at the fairgrounds after the premium sale.
14. **All exhibitors must be a bona fide 4-H or FFA member at time of entry and must be enrolled in grade, high school, or home schooled in Murray County by nomination date.**
15. 4-H Members turning 9 years of age by show date will be eligible to show providing they have met all pre-entry requirements. All exhibitors in the 3rd grade and 8 years old may show according to OYE Rules.
16. Dress Code will be 4-H and FFA dress and no head dress.
17. All 4-H and FFA exhibitors will forfeit all premium money if thank you notes are not presented to Ag Ed Teachers or OSU Extension Staff within 30 days of receiving premium sale list.

**Premium checks will be forfeited if not cashed by July 1, 2017
NO EXCEPTIONS.**

18. All protests must be submitted in writing and signed by protester to official show committee and must be accompanied by \$100.00 cash deposit that will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. The respective organizational leader, (4-H or FFA) should be notified prior to protest. No protest can be made more than 24 hours following conclusion of preceding show. Forfeited deposits will be deposited into the general show fund.
19. Academic ineligibility will be determined on the week of the show date by school superintendent to disqualify student and animal, **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
20. Any 4-H or FFA exhibitor, parent or adult associated with an exhibitor will not be permitted to hit, slap, or neglect an animal, deprive of food or water, inject or insert foreign materials under the skin or into the muscle, or participate in any other form of animal abuse while participating in any way with the show. No injections of any type permitted without show committee pre-approval. Those observed abusing, be it child or adult, will be banned from participating in both the 2015 show and auction. Exhibitors must abide by the Oklahoma 4-H and FFA showing code of ethics posted in the Exhibit Barn.
21. All animals must have identification tags, ear notches, and /or tattoos affixed to the animals at the time of entry. Ear tags must be installed.
22. Junior exhibitors, and adults involved with the exhibitors, are expected to adhere to the General Rules and Regulations of Junior Livestock shows including the Show Ring Code of Ethics as well as the Rules and Regulations governing the Junior Division.
23. No alcohol allowed on Murray County Expo Property.

A Sale fee of \$25.00 will be assessed to each exhibitor for show expenses.

Swine Division

- Market Barrows must weigh between 190-280 pounds.
- Commercial Breeding Gilts must weigh a minimum of 190 lbs. and be born after Aug. 1, 2016. Breeding Gilts must be accompanied by original registration papers in exhibitors name and will show by age. Failure to provide papers will be moved to Crossbred breed the day of weigh in.
- All breeds will be divided into classes and shown by weight.
- Dressing of hogs will be with water only at showing. No paint, powder, dye, white wash, oil or other dressing.
