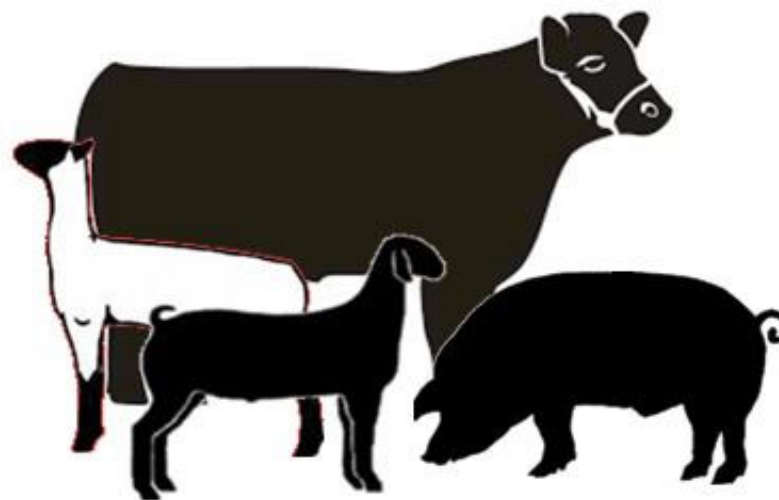

 5:00– 7:00 P.M. Enter and check papers on heifers. Enter and Official weigh in for Market steers, Prospect steers, Swine, Sheep and Goats

Friday, February 28th 7:30 A.M. Register for Livestock Judging Contest
 8:00 A.M. Livestock Judging Contest begins
 1:00 P.M. Sheep Show Begins
 Goat Show Begins 30 minutes after the Completion of the Sheep show.

Saturday, February 29th 9:00 A.M. Swine Show Begins

BONUSES

1. Prior to the show, a bonus committee will determine the (approximate) entry and bonuses. Bonuses will be given in as equitable manner as possible..
2. Bonuses will be determined by percentage of species shown.
3. Show for bonus order will follow the judging of each division.
4. Exhibitors must be present to show for Show Back Order and Bonus Order. If they are not present then they will forfeit the opportunity to receive Bonus Money. The only exception will be in the case of illness and other sanctioned school activities. In the event of illness or other school activities, the show superintendent must be notified prior to the start of species judging. The substitute show person may only be another exhibitor showing an animal in the Pawnee County Spring Livestock show.
5. The owner of each animal that enters and shows will receive a Class Premium no matter where they place in their class.
6. Exhibitors in the Market steer, Prospect steer, Market swine, Market lamb and Market goat divisions are eligible to receive full bonuses on two animals if they have a second animal selected in the bonus order.
7. An Exhibitor may receive the following Awards:
Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion and 3rd Place awards in: Market Steers, Market Sheep, Market Swine, & Market Goats
Grand Champion & Reserve Grand Champion Awards in: Prospect Steers
BUT: An Exhibitor may only receive 2 bonus monies per market species.

GENERAL SHOW RULES

1. The Pawnee County Jr. Livestock Show is a complete show in its own right.
2. Every exhibitor is responsible for cleaning their stalls during the show, and removing their exhibits from the show barn upon completion of the show. At the completion of the show there will be no stall clean up, however we would appreciate your help in tear down and storage of equipment.
3. All animals must be presented in an appropriate show manner, the species superintendent, or the show superintendent has the discretion to warn exhibitors or ban the exhibits for failure to comply with this rule. The superintendent will check animals before the show for cleanliness.
4. Any animal that is determined to be a Cryptorchid will not be allowed to show.
5. Entries must be shown by their owners, except in the case of illness, other sanctioned school activities or in the case of one exhibitor owning two animals in the same class. In the event of illness or other school activities, the show superintendent must be notified prior to the start of species judging. The substitute show person may only be another exhibitor within local community, first preference within same club, showing an animal in the Pawnee County Spring Livestock Show.
6. Any protest must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$150.00. The deposit will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. The protest must be filed prior to dismissal of animals or the time the general show superintendent has declared the livestock show over. It shall be decided by the Board of Directors and their decision is final.
7. No feed will be allowed in the show arena.
8. No drugs will be allowed, unless prescribed by a veterinarian and approved by the General Superintendent and Species Superintendent before administering.
9. The Board of Directors reserves the right to amend these rules as they, in their judgment, deem advisable.
10. Due to safety, no heat lamps or heating devices allowed in bedding areas.
11. No one in the barns from 12:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.

GUIDELINES FOR LOSS OF ANIMALS DUE TO TRAGEDY

1. The board will not consider any tragedy occurring after January 31st.
2. 48 hour notification to a board member.
3. Board meeting within 48 hours of being notified of tragedy if possible.
4. Total nominated livestock projects owned by exhibitor would have to be destroyed by tragedy.
5. Exhibitor would be allowed 7 days from board approval to replace animals and to be renominated.
6. Animals of same species and recognized breed being exhibited at show. Replace with same breed if possible. If another breed purchased then it must be exhibited as a crossbred.
7. 2/3 replacement of all animals destroyed (loss) with a maximum of 2 head total for each species lost.

ELIGIBILITY

1. All 4-H and FFA members must be eligible as provided by their particular school system and by their school administration. If ineligible the 1st day of the show/ weigh-in/entry then ineligible for the whole show.
2. No exhibitor is eligible to exhibit at Pawnee County Jr. Livestock Show if they have exhibited at any other county show the same show season.
3. If any exhibitor is banned from any state show then he/she also loses their eligibility for showing at Pawnee County Jr. Livestock Show.
4. If an exhibitor is ineligible or suspended from school then their animals are ineligible also.

GOAT SHOW RULES

1. All entrants must own and personally care for Market and Breeding Does by Dec. 9th.
2. All goats showing must have in their ear a PCJLS tag, PCFF tag, OYE tag or Tulsa tag, or legible tattoo with papers in exhibitors name.
3. All does must have a scrapies tag or tattoo in ear as required by the Oklahoma State Scrapie law. With out such tag or tattoo animal will have to leave the grounds immediately and will not be allowed to show.
4. An exhibitor cannot exceed four (4) combined goat entries with no more than three (3) in either division (market or doe).
5. Exhibitor must be present and assisting with and or grooming his or her animal in preparation for showing.
6. Goats do not have to be dehorned, however horns should be tipped and rounded. Goats with horns sharper than deemed safe by the show superintendent will be required to be tipped or rounded or isolated and not shown. Goats in the Mkt & Breeding shows do not have to be slick shorn. It is up to the discretion of the exhibitor.
7. No added hair can be used on any livestock.
8. No paints, powders, dyes or any other coloring agents will be permitted on any animal shown.
9. There will be no maximum weight limit but there is a minimum of 40 pounds.
10. No tooth rule.

MARKET GOATS

1. Wethers and does can be shown together in market divisions. Does can show in breeding division or market division but not both.

BREEDING DOES

1. Selection of Supreme Champion and Reserve Supreme Champion Breeding Doe will follow the judging of the Breeding Doe Division.

BRED AND OWNED

1. There will be a Bred and Owned show for goats Male and Females will show against each other with a award to be awarded to the Champion..
2. Only one entry per exhibitor.
3. Exhibitor must own Doe at the time of conception.

SHOWMANSHIP

1. Champ. and Res. Champ. showmanship awards will be awarded to the top 2 exhibitors in each specie in the Jr, Inter and Sr. Divisions. Divisions are determined by Grade: Jr (3rd – 6th), Inter. (7th—9th) and Sr (10th—12th).
2. During the showmanship contest, the exhibitor must show an animal that they own and did exhibit. If an exhibitor has only one animal in the entire show and that animal weighs out then the exhibitor can show the animal in showmanship only.

LAMB SHOW RULES

1. All entrants must own and personally care for market and breeding lambs by Dec. 9th.
2. All sheep showing must have in their ear a PCJLS tag, PCFF tag, OYE tag or Tulsa tag, or legible tattoo with papers in exhibitors name.
3. All ewe lambs must have a scrapies tag in the ear as stated in the Oklahoma State Scrapie law. If a ewe does not have a scrapie tag, it will leave the grounds immediately and will not be allowed to show without such tag.
4. An exhibitor cannot exceed four (4) combined sheep entries with no more than three (3) in either division (ewe or market).
5. Show will recognize all breeds known at nomination.
6. All animals must be consistent with breed characteristics at time of nomination and may only be amended by the General Superintendent and the Species Superintendent Per characteristics at time of show. No nomination information will be changed after nomination date except by the General Superintendent and the Species Superintendent.
7. Exhibitor must be present and assisting with grooming his or her animal in preparation for showing.
8. All market and breeding lambs must be slick shorn, with at least a 13 tooth comb, including the head, before entering the show ring. There can be no wool above the knees or hocks. No wool cap on the head
9. No added hair can be used on any livestock.
10. No paints, powders, dyes or any other coloring agents will be permitted on any animal shown.
11. All lambs must have a minimum weight limit of 70 lbs.
12. No tooth rule.

MARKET LAMBS

1. Wether and ewe lambs can be shown together in market division.
2. Exhibitors can show a ewe in the market division or ewe division, but they cannot show in both divisions.

EWELAMBS

1. Selection of the Supreme Champion and Reserve Supreme Champion Ewe will follow the judging of the ewe division.

BRED AND OWNED

1. There will be a Bred and Owned show for sheep Male and Females will show against each other with a award to be awarded to the Champion..
2. Only one entry per species per exhibitor.
3. Exhibitor must own Ewe at the time of conception.

SHOWMANSHIP

1. Champ. and Res. Champ. showmanship awards will be awarded to the top 2 exhibitors in each specie in the Jr, Inter and Sr. Divisions. Divisions are determined by Grade: Jr (3rd – 6th), Inter. (7th—9th) and Sr (10th—12th).
2. During the showmanship contest, the exhibitor must show an animal that they own and did exhibit. If an exhibitor has only one animal in the entire show and that animal weighs out then the exhibitor can show the animal in showmanship only.

NOMINATIONS AND FAMILY NOMINATIONS

1. All animals showing at Pawnee County Jr. Livestock Show must be nominated to a representative of the Show Board by Dec. 9th Every animal exhibited must have in their ear a PCJLS tag , PCFF tag, Tulsa State Fair tag or an OYE tag for the year of the show to show. All swine must have 840 tags (EID tags).
2. Nominations for students moving into Pawnee County after Dec. 9th must be made within 30 days of enrollment.
3. There is a \$3.00/animal nomination fee to be paid at the time of nomination.
4. Each exhibitor shall provide for each animal a nomination card at nomination time indicating breed, tag number or legible tattoo number for registered heifers. Both the parent/guardian and the student's signature are required on the nomination card.
5. Livestock can be family nominated.

EXHIBITORS

1. All exhibitors must be either:
 - A. Pawnee County 4-H Club member attending or residing within a Pawnee County School or Woodland School district.
 - B. An FFA member of Cleveland, Pawnee, or Woodland Public Schools
2. Exhibitors must be eight (8) years and in 3rd Grade before Sept 1 or turned 9 years of age by the 1st day of the show
 - A. It is further described that the Junior Division will be any exhibitor 8-12 years of age on the date of the show.
 - B. The Intermediate Division will be any exhibitor 13-15 years of age on the date of the show.
 - C. The Senior Division will be any exhibitor sixteen (16) years of age or above on the date of the show.
3. Minimum Class time should be lost from school by 4-H and FFA youths participating.

BEEF SHOW RULES

1. All entrants must own and personally care for all Steers and Heifers by Dec. 9th.
2. All beef showing must have in their ear a PCJLS tag, PCFF tag, OYE tag or Tulsa tag, or legible tattoo with papers in exhibitors name.
3. An exhibitor cannot exceed four (4) total beef entries.
4. Show will recognize all breeds known at nomination.
5. Exhibitor must be present and assisting with grooming his or her animal in preparation for showing.
6. No added hair can be used on any livestock.
7. No paints, powders, dyes or any other coloring agents will be permitted on any animal shown.
8. No tooth rule.
9. Mini Beef can only show 2 consecutive years.
10. Minimum weight on all beef (steers and heifers) 500 lbs. except for Miniature Beef

MARKET STEERS

1. Each entrant can enter three (3) Market steers. (Four (4) total beef entries only)
2. Classes will be split by weight at the discretion of the show superintendent.
3. Market steers will weigh 1000 lbs. or more.

PROSPECT STEERS

1. Each entrant can enter three (3) prospect steers. (Four (4) total beef entries only)
2. Prospect steers will weigh **500 lbs. to** 999 lbs.

HEIFERS

1. Each entrant can enter three (3) heifers. (Four (4) total beef entries only)
2. All heifers must have registration papers in the exhibitors name available at the time of entry. Registration paper must indicate the appropriate tattoo number and show that the animal no born before January 1, more than 2 years prior to show. If registration paper is not available at time of entry then will be shown as a commercial heifer.
3. All commercial heifers will be tagged at nomination and be shown by weight and must not be born before January 1, more than 2 years prior to show.
4. Selection of Supreme Champion and Reserve Supreme Champion Heifer will follow the judging of the heifer division.

BRED AND OWNED

1. There will be a Bred and Owned show for beef Male and Females will show against each other with a award to be awarded to the Champion..
2. Only one entry per species per exhibitor.
3. Exhibitor must own Cow/heifer at the time of conception.

SHOWMANSHIP

1. Champ. and Res. Champ. showmanship awards will be awarded to the top 2 exhibitors in each specie in the Jr, Inter and Sr. Divisions. Divisions are determined by Grade: Jr (3rd – 6th), Inter. (7th—9th) and Sr (10th—12th).
2. During the showmanship contest, the exhibitor must show an animal that they own and did exhibit. If an exhibitor has only one animal in the entire show and that animal weighs out then the exhibitor can show the animal in showmanship only.

SWINE SHOW RULES

1. All entrants must own and personally care for Market and Breeding Swine by Dec. 9th.
2. All swine showing must have in their ear a 840 tag. (EID tag)
3. An exhibitor cannot exceed four (4) combined swine entries with no more than three (3) in either division (market or breeding).
4. Each exhibitor can show a gilt in the market or breeding gilt division, but they cannot show the same animal in both divisions
5. Exhibitor must be present and assisting with and or grooming his or her animal in preparation for showing.
6. No added hair can be used on any livestock.
7. No paints, powders, dyes or any other coloring agents will be permitted on any animal shown.

MARKET SWINE

1. Market swine will have a minimum weight of 210 lbs. and maximum of 280 lbs. with no weigh back. Official weigh in will be Thursday night prior to show.
2. Gilts that weigh out of market division can be shown in the gilt division.
3. Any Barrows 281 pounds and over will be shown in a class for class money only.
4. All light weight Market Swine 170-209 pounds will show in a light weight class or class money only. (The light weight Market Swine will show with the light weight Breeding Gilts.)

BREEDING GILTS

1. Breeding Gilts will have a minimum weight limit of 210 lbs.
2. Selection of Supreme Champion and Reserve Supreme Champion Breeding Gilts will follow the judging of the Breeding Gilt division.
3. All light weight Breeding Gilts 170-209 pounds will show in a light weight class for class money only. (The light weight Breeding Gilts will show with the light weight Market Swine.)

BRED AND OWNED

1. There will be a Bred and Owned show for swine Male and Females will show against each other with an award to be awarded to the Champion..
2. Only one entry per species per exhibitor.
3. Exhibitor must own sow/gilt at the time of conception.

SHOWMANSHIP

1. Champ. and Res. Champ. showmanship awards will be awarded to the top 2 exhibitors in each specie in the Jr, Inter and Sr. Divisions. Divisions are determined by Grade: Jr (3rd – 6th), Inter. (7th—9th) and Sr (10th—12th).
2. During the showmanship contest, the exhibitor must show an animal that they own and did exhibit. If an exhibitor has only one animal in the entire show and that animal weighs out then the exhibitor can show the animal in showmanship only.
