Reasons for choosing this outfit



Who am I?

- Give your name
- The name of your 4-H club
- Tell how long you have been a 4-H member



Tell things I do in this outfit

- Tell about the places you go when you wear this outfit.
- Tell if you wear it to special activities

How this outfit fits into my wardrobe

- Can you mix and match this outfit with other things that you have in your wardrobe.

How this outfit makes me feel

- Is it your favorite color?
- Does the color go well with your skin, hair and eye color?
- Does wearing this garment make you feel special?
- Do you feel like you fit in with your peers if you wear this type of garment?



How do you take care of this outfit?

- Look for the care label with instructions on the tag inside the clothing.
- Check the fiber content.
- Share this information with the judges.

Personal Grooming Tips

- Good posture
- Comb hair
- Wash face
- Clean shoes
- Wear belt if garment has belt loops
- Wear slips under dresses
- Socks should match clothing color
- Accessories suitable to outfit



Points to think about while giving your presentation

- Use good grammar
- Make your speech clear, smooth and natural
- Look at the judge while you are giving your speech
- Stay within the 1 and ½ minute time limit

You may model clothing in any of the three following categories:

Casual Wear (example) garment you wear to school, fairs, rodeos, dates, movies, shopping, etc.

Active Sportswear (example) garment you would wear playing basketball, baseball, skiing, etc.

Dress Wear (example) garment you would wear to a wedding, party, church, formal event, etc.

First year 4-H'ers may carry note cards that have the following information on them.

1. Fabric Content
2. How to care for the garment
3. Where you would wear the garment
4. How does it go with other items of clothing you own
5. Other information on why you selected the garment

If you are in the fifth grade or older, you must have your 1 and ½ minute presentation memorized.
